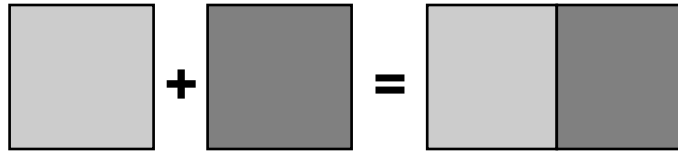
Chiclets Quilt Pattern

An introduction to Half-Square Triangles

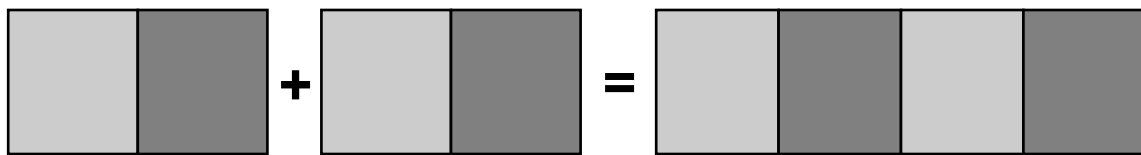
This quilt was made with scraps from my stash; so I did not figure yardage. Brandy

1: Cut 144 2-1/2" squares from print fabric.

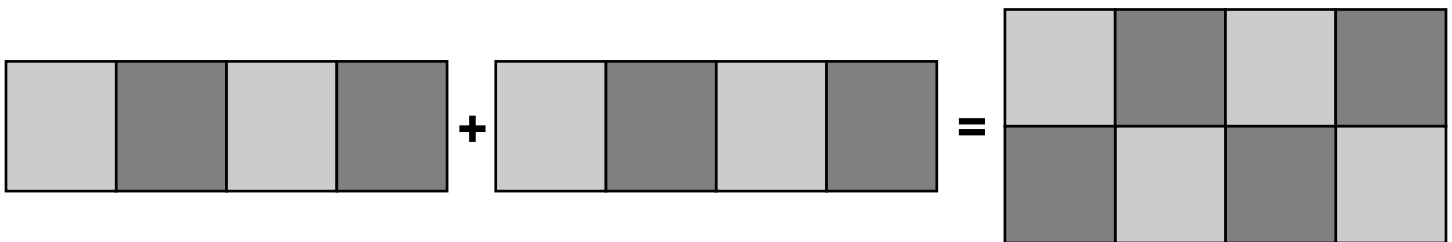
2: Sew the squares into groups of 2.



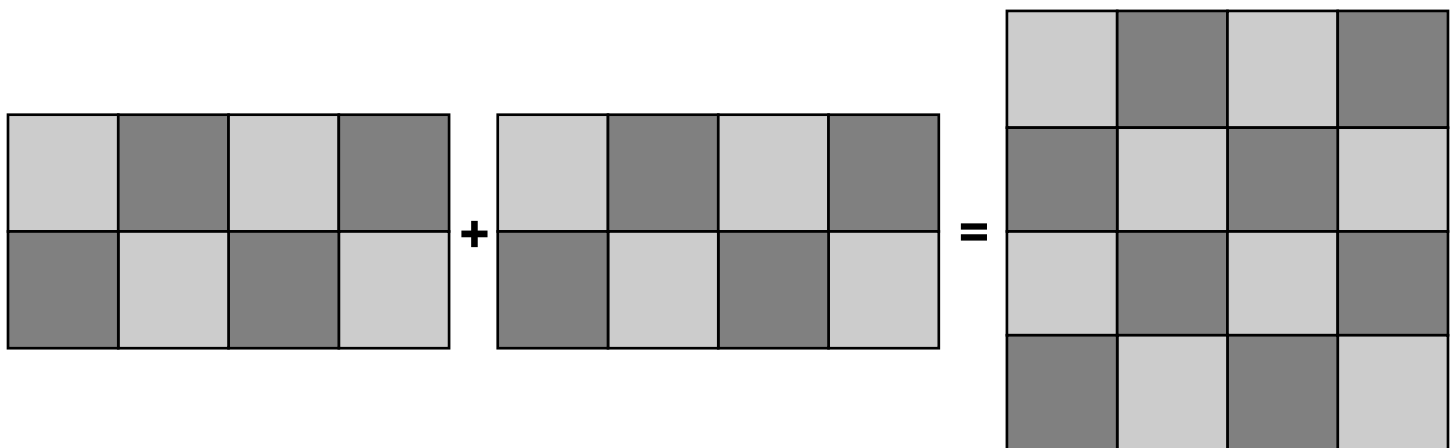
3: Sew sets of 2 together to make strips of 4 squares.



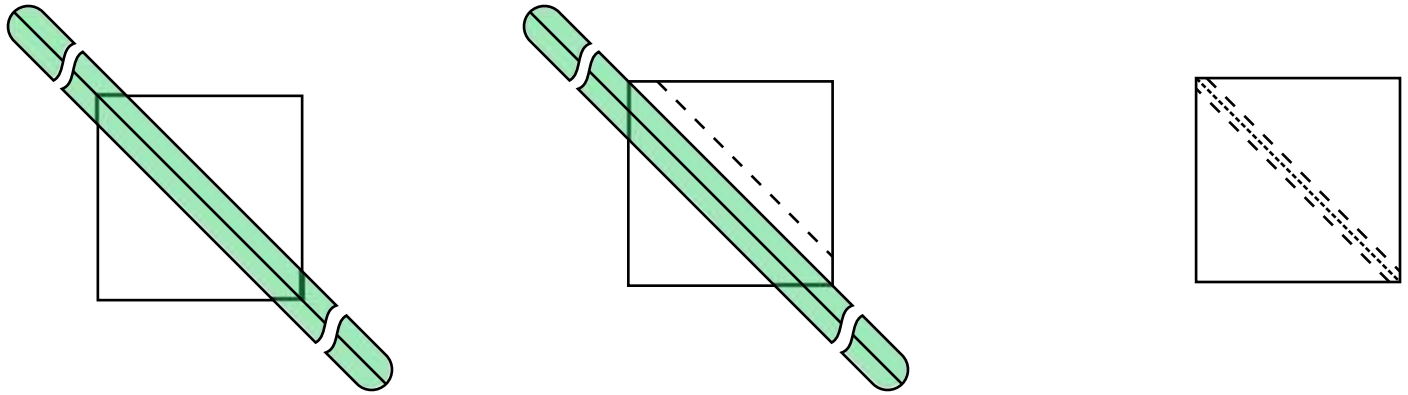
4: Sew 2 groups of 4 blocks together as shown.



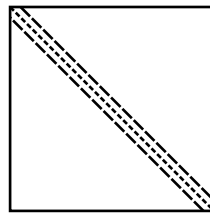
5: Sew two groups of 8 together to make the center of the block.



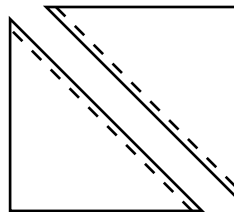
- 6: Cut scraps into 36 3-1/2" squares.
- 7: Cut 36 more 3-1/2" squares from background fabric.
- 8: Place one 3-1/2" print and one 3-1/2" background squares right- sides together with the lighter fabric on top.
- 9: Using the HST Whiz Kid, draw diagonal lines per directions supplied with the HST Whiz Kid.



- 10: Sew on the 2 outside lines.

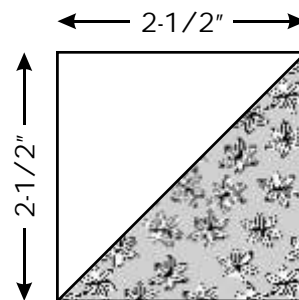
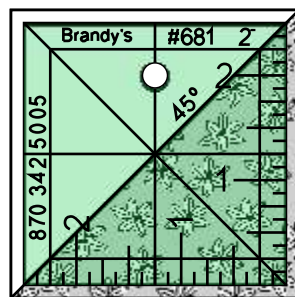


- 11: Cut apart on the center line.

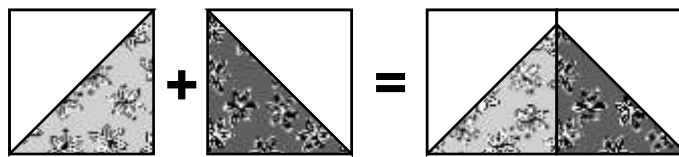


- 12: Iron open with seam to the dark fabric.

- 13: Square-up the half-square triangles using the 2" Squar-Um.



14: Sew 2 HST together to make a pair as shown.

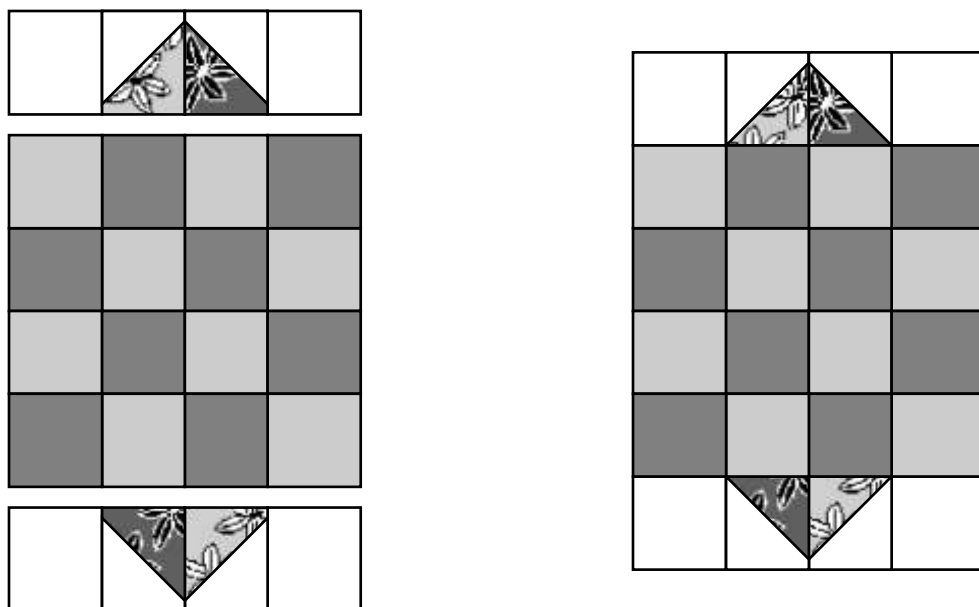


15: Cut 108 2-1/2" squares from background fabric.

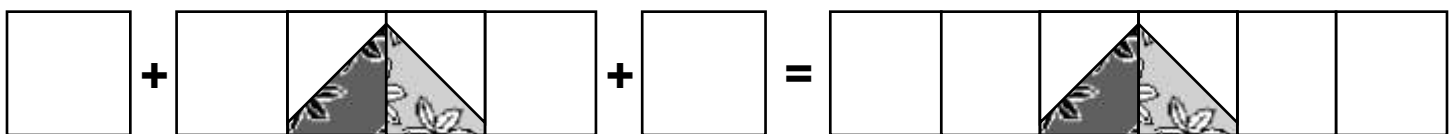
16: Sew one 2-1/2" background square to each side of the HST pairs as shown.



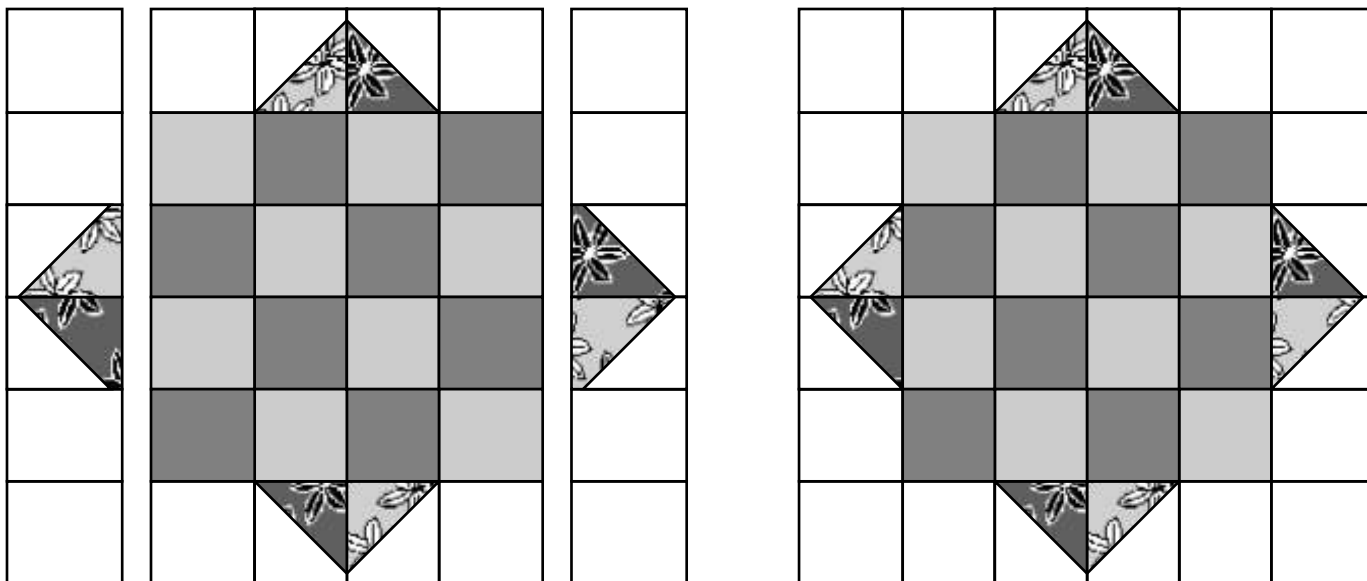
17: Sew one of the HST groups to the top and bottom of the blocks centers.



18: Sew one more 2-1/2" background block to each end of the remaining HST groups.

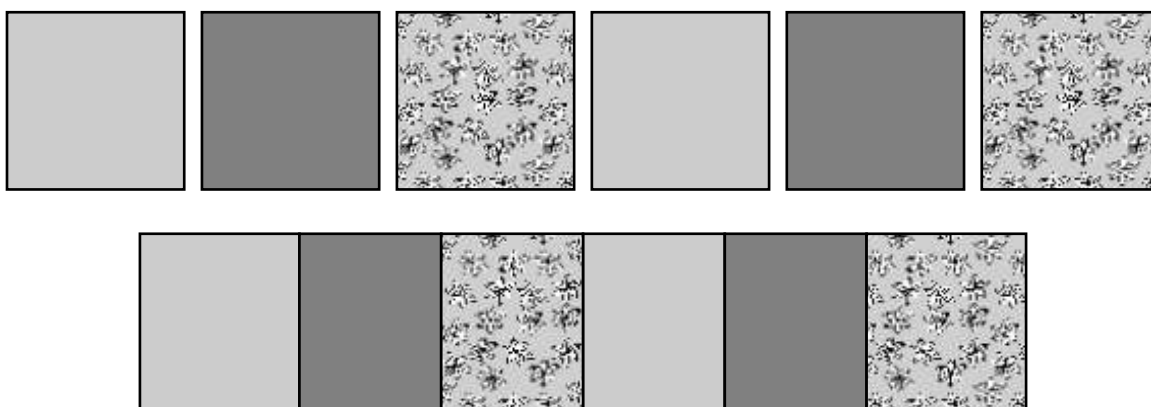


19: Sew a 6 block HST group to each side of the block assemblies.

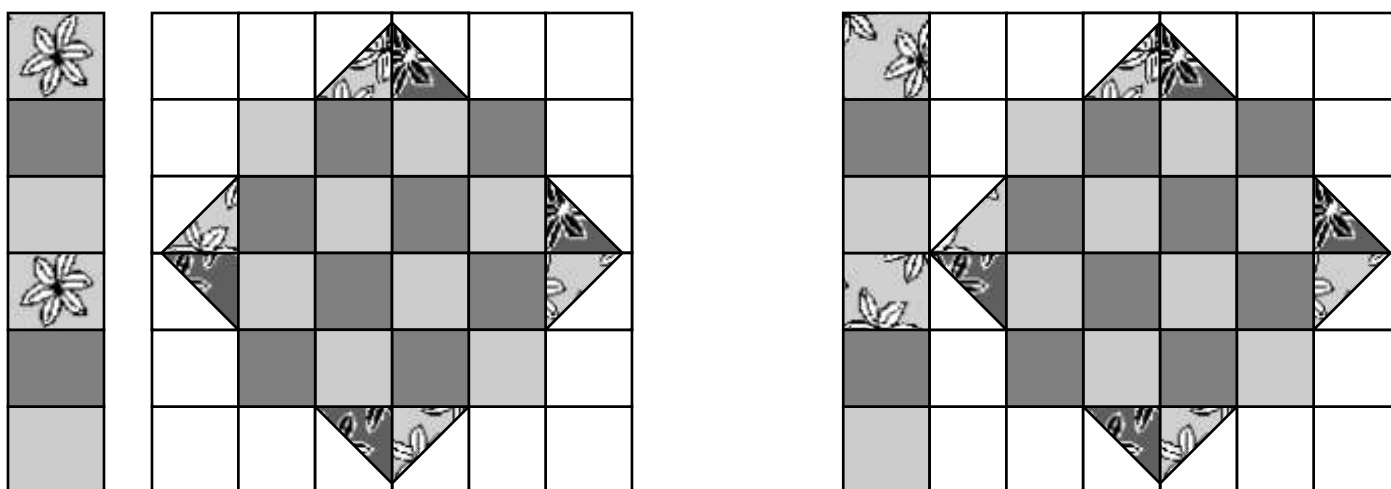


20: Cut 76 each 2-1/2" squares from print fabric for the border.

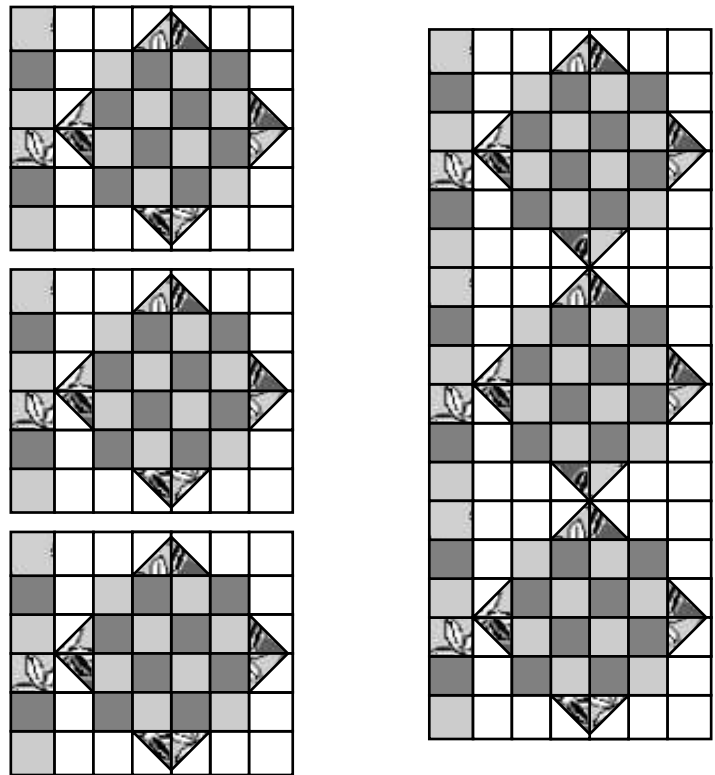
21: Sew into strips of 6 squares.



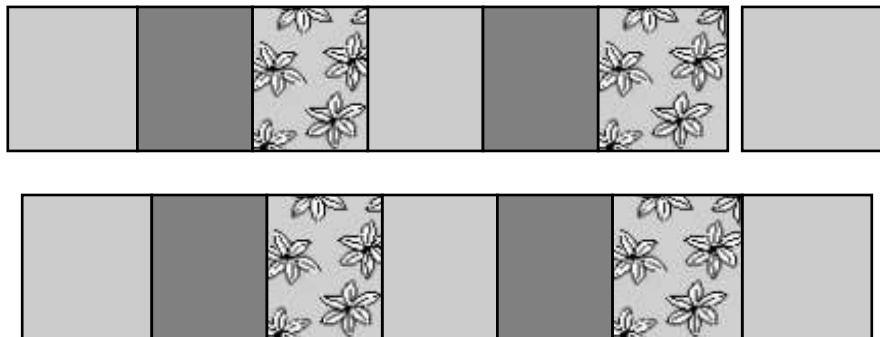
22: Sew a six square strip to the side of 3 blocks.



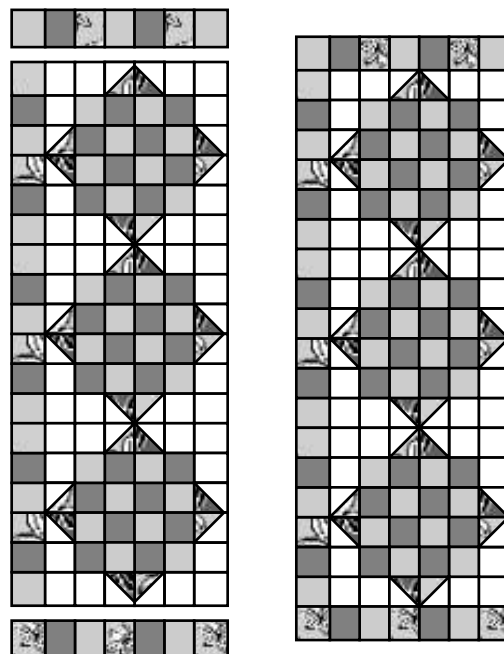
23: Sew the 3 blocks together.



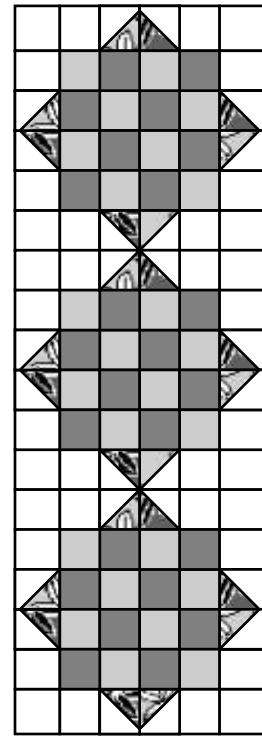
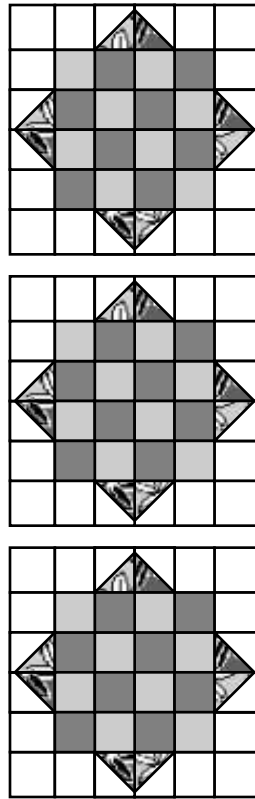
24: Make 4 strips of 7 squares by adding a square to 6 block strips.



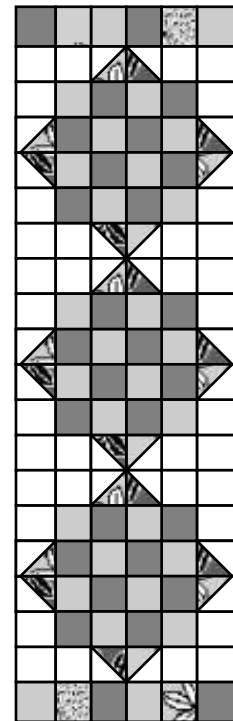
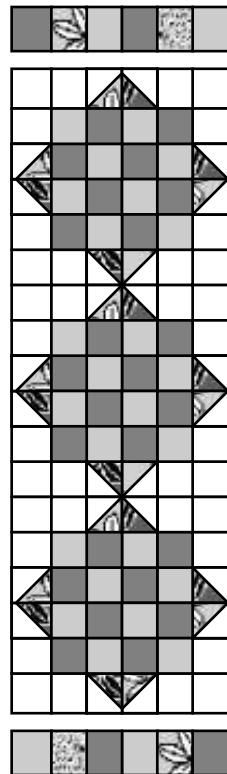
25: Sew a 7 square strip to the top and bottom of the 3 block set.



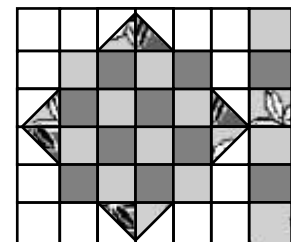
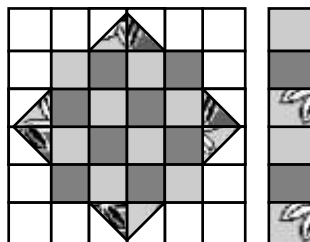
26: Sew 3 more blocks together.



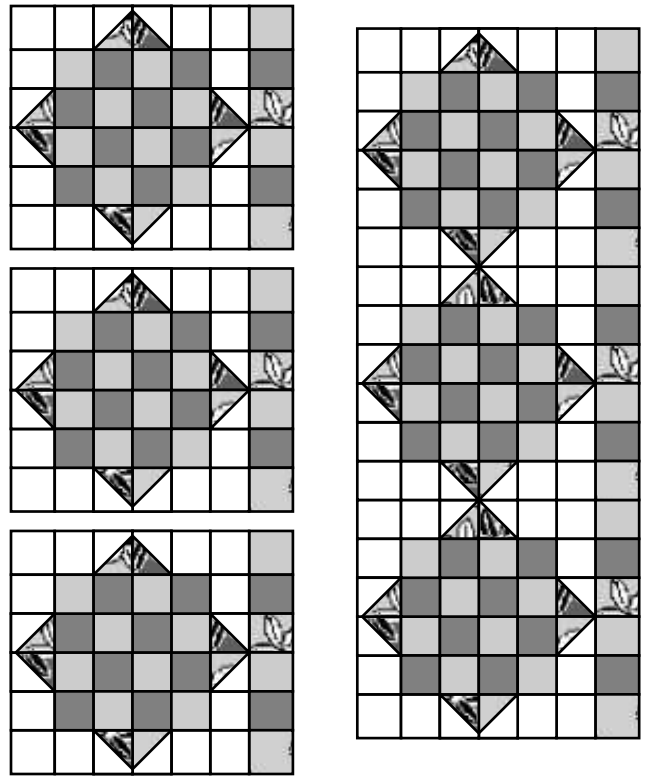
27: Sew a 6 block strip to the top and bottom of the just assembled 3 block set.



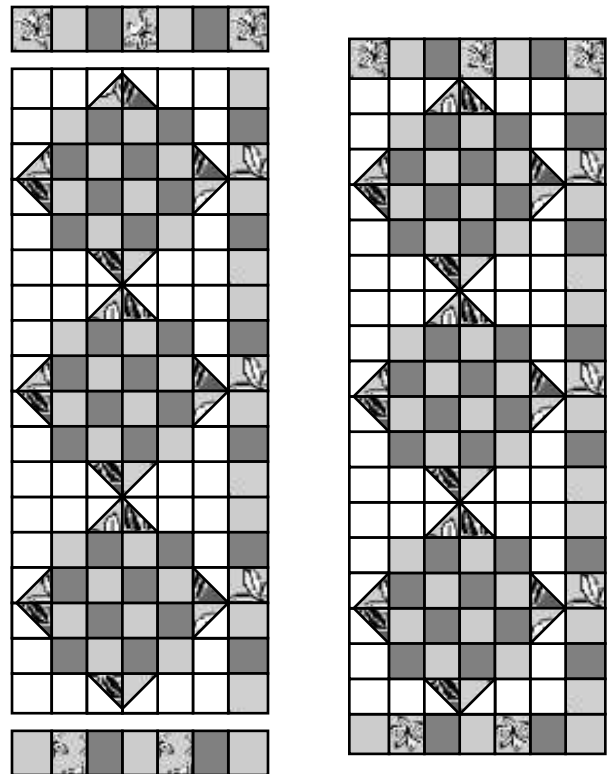
28: Sew a 6 square strip onto one side of 3 blocks.



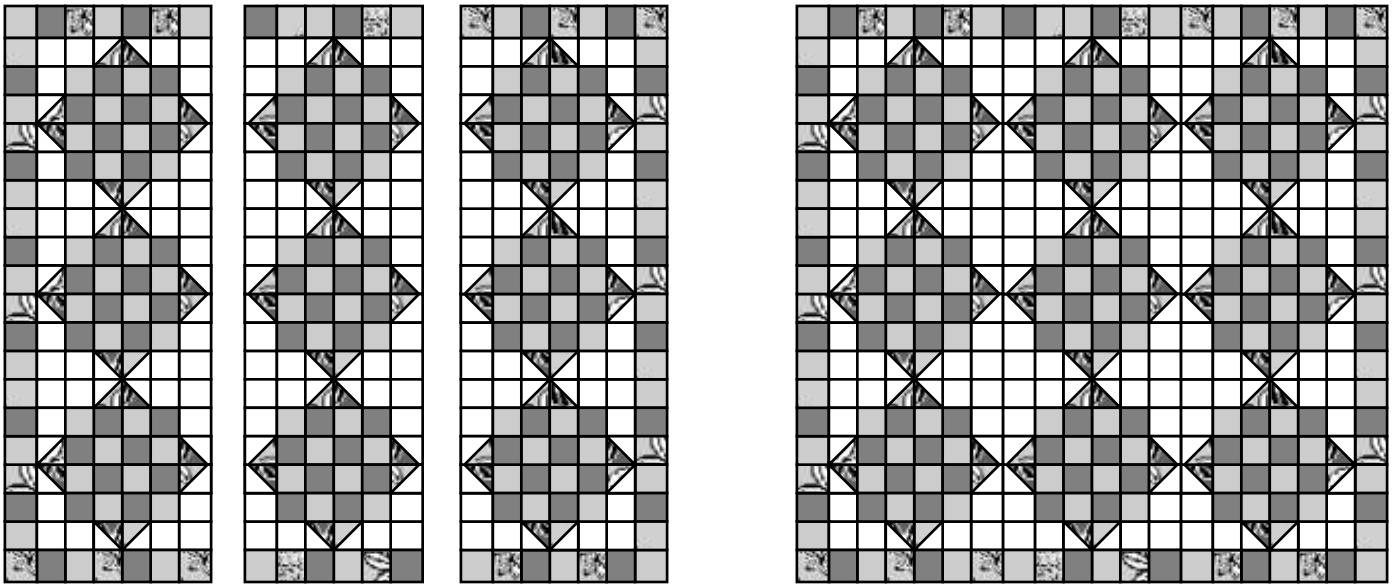
29: Sew the three blocks together.



30: Sew a 7 square strip to the top and bottom of the 3 block set.



31: Sew the 3 groups of 3 blocks together.



32: Cut backing fabric to a 44" x 44" square.

33: Cut batting to a 44" x 44" square.

34: Layer quilt.

35: Quilt as desired

36: Trim and bind quilt.
